- RIB CAGE: FORMED BY RIBS AND THE STERNUM, THE RIB CAGE PROTECTS THE HEART AND LUNGS WHILE ALLOWING FOR THE EXPANSION OF THE CHEST DURING RESPIRATION.

APPENDICULAR SKELETON

THE APPENDICULAR SKELETON COMPRISES THE LIMBS AND THEIR ATTACHMENTS TO THE AXIAL SKELETON. IN WOLVES, THIS SECTION IS CRUCIAL FOR LOCOMOTION AND AGILITY.

- FORELIMBS: THE FORELIMBS ARE ADAPTED FOR RUNNING AND PROVIDE STABILITY DURING MOVEMENT. THEY INCLUDE THE HUMERUS, RADIUS, AND ULNA.
