ADDITIONALLY, GREAT BUSINESS DOCUMENTARIES OFTEN HIGHLIGHT BROADER THEMES SUCH AS ENTREPRENEURSHIP, CORPORATE RESPONSIBILITY, AND THE IMPACT OF TECHNOLOGY ON INDUSTRY. THEY NOT ONLY SHOWCASE THE SUCCESSES BUT ALSO DELVE INTO FAILURES, PROVIDING A BALANCED VIEW OF THE BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT.
