OVER TIME, THE MINERALS FROM SALIVA COMBINE WITH THE PLAQUE, LEADING TO CALCIFICATION. THIS PROCESS CREATES A ROUGH SURFACE ON THE TEETH THAT CAN HARBOR MORE PLAQUE AND BACTERIA, FURTHER COMPLICATING ORAL HYGIENE EFFORTS.

Dental calculus can be classified into two primary types: supragingival and subgingival. Supragingival calculus is found above the gum line and is usually visible as a yellow or white deposit. In contrast, subgingival calculus forms below the gum line and is typically darker in color, often appearing black or dark brown. Both types of calculus can lead to various dental issues if not addressed promptly.

CAUSES OF DENTAL CALCULUS

Understanding the causes of dental calculus formation is essential for effective prevention and management. Several factors contribute to the development of calculus dental, including:
