The senior seminar offers the last opportunity for students to review, refine and demonstrate the essential skills needed to get a job and to succeed in the industry, from competency in creative problem-solving, critical thinking, and effective oral and written communication to ethical reasoning, quantitative analyses, and the use of technology. After all, the majority of graduating students will have to put these concepts into practice in a very short period of time. Graduate business programs with an emphasis in hospitality can use this book as an introduction to graduate courses.
