VASOACTIVE MEDICATIONS

These medications regulate blood pressure and cardiac output in critically ill patients. Common vasoactive drugs include norepinephrine, dopamine, and epinephrine. They are administered via central lines under close monitoring to stabilize circulation and support organ perfusion.

DIALYSIS AND RENAL SUPPORT

Acute kidney injury is a frequent complication in ICU patients. Renal replacement therapies such as continuous renal replacement therapy (CRRT) or intermittent hemodialysis may be required to remove waste products and maintain fluid balance. These procedures demand specialized equipment and nursing care.

INVASIVE PROCEDURES

FAMILY INVOLVEMENT AND COMMUNICATION

EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION BETWEEN HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS AND FAMILIES IS FUNDAMENTAL IN THE ICU SETTING. FAMILIES PLAY A KEY ROLE IN ADVOCATING FOR THE PATIENT AND ASSISTING WITH CARE DECISIONS.

VISITATION POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

VISITATION POLICIES VARY ACROSS INSTITUTIONS BUT AIM TO BALANCE INFECTION CONTROL WITH THE EMOTIONAL NEEDS OF PATIENTS AND FAMILIES. FLEXIBLE VISITATION SCHEDULES AND OPEN COMMUNICATION CAN ENHANCE FAMILY PRESENCE AND INVOLVEMENT WITHOUT COMPROMISING PATIENT SAFETY.

COMMUNICATING WITH THE MEDICAL TEAM
