BIOGRAPHY OF KHADIJA

HER SOCIAL STATUS AND ECONOMIC INDEPENDENCE WERE EXCEPTIONAL FOR WOMEN OF HER TIME, HIGHLIGHTING HER UNIQUE POSITION IN ARABIAN SOCIETY.

EARLY LIFE AND BACKGROUND

Khadija was born into a noble family and enjoyed a privileged upbringing that equipped her with the skills necessary for business and leadership.
