CHRISTIANITY

CHRISTIANITY IS ONE OF THE MAJOR WORLD RELIGIONS AND THE LARGEST BY NUMBER OF ADHERENTS GLOBALLY. IT IS BASED ON THE LIFE, TEACHINGS, DEATH, AND RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST. CHRISTIANS BELIEVE IN ONE GOD WHO EXISTS AS A HOLY TRINITY: THE FATHER, THE SON, AND THE HOLY SPIRIT. THE BIBLE IS THE SACRED SCRIPTURE OF CHRISTIANITY, CONSISTING OF THE OLD TESTAMENT AND THE NEW TESTAMENT.

ORIGINS AND HISTORY

CHRISTIANITY ORIGINATED IN THE 1ST CENTURY CE IN THE ROMAN PROVINCE OF JUDEA. IT EMERGED FROM JEWISH TRADITIONS AND QUICKLY SPREAD THROUGHOUT THE ROMAN EMPIRE AND BEYOND. THE RELIGION EVOLVED THROUGH VARIOUS DENOMINATIONS, INCLUDING ROMAN CATHOLICISM, EASTERN ORTHODOXY, AND PROTESTANTISM, EACH WITH DISTINCT DOCTRINES AND PRACTICES.

CORE BELIEFS AND PRACTICES

CHRISTIANITY HAS PROFOUNDLY INFLUENCED ART, CULTURE, LAW, AND ETHICS THROUGHOUT HISTORY. IT REMAINS A MAJOR FORCE IN SHAPING SOCIETAL VALUES AND GLOBAL HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS.

ISLAM

ISLAM IS ANOTHER OF THE MAJOR WORLD RELIGIONS, SECOND ONLY TO CHRISTIANITY IN THE NUMBER OF FOLLOWERS WORLDWIDE. IT IS A MONOTHEISTIC FAITH FOUNDED ON THE TEACHINGS OF THE PROPHET MUHAMMAD IN THE 7TH CENTURY CE. THE QURAN IS THE HOLY BOOK OF ISLAM, BELIEVED TO BE THE LITERAL WORD OF GOD AS REVEALED TO MUHAMMAD.

FOUNDATIONAL BELIEFS

ISLAM CENTERS ON THE BELIEF IN ONE GOD (ALLAH) AND THE FIVE PILLARS OF ISLAM, WHICH GUIDE MUSLIMS IN THEIR FAITH AND PRACTICE. THESE PILLARS ARE THE DECLARATION OF FAITH (SHAHADA), PRAYER (SALAT), ALMSGIVING (ZAKAT), FASTING DURING RAMADAN (SAWM), AND PILGRIMAGE TO MECCA (HAJJ).

BRANCHES OF ISLAM

THE TWO MAIN BRANCHES OF ISLAM ARE SUNNI AND SHIA, WHICH DIFFER IN ASPECTS OF THEOLOGY AND LEADERSHIP. DESPITE THESE DIFFERENCES, BOTH GROUPS SHARE FUNDAMENTAL BELIEFS AND PRACTICES.

CULTURAL AND SOCIAL IMPACT

ISLAM HAS SIGNIFICANTLY INFLUENCED THE ARTS, SCIENCES, LAW, AND POLITICS IN MANY REGIONS, ESPECIALLY ACROSS THE MIDDLE EAST, NORTH AFRICA, AND PARTS OF ASIA. MUSLIM COMMUNITIES WORLDWIDE CONTRIBUTE TO DIVERSE CULTURAL AND INTELLECTUAL TRADITIONS.

HINDUISM

HINDUISM IS ONE OF THE OLDEST MAJOR WORLD RELIGIONS AND IS PREDOMINANTLY PRACTICED IN INDIA AND NEPAL. IT COMPRISES A COMPLEX SYSTEM OF BELIEFS, RITUALS, AND PHILOSOPHIES RATHER THAN A SINGLE UNIFIED DOCTRINE. HINDUISM IS CHARACTERIZED BY ITS DIVERSITY OF GODS, SCRIPTURES, AND SPIRITUAL PRACTICES.

CORE CONCEPTS

IMPORTANT HINDU SCRIPTURES INCLUDE THE VEDAS, UPANISHADS, BHAGAVAD GITA, AND RAMAYANA. THESE TEXTS PROVIDE GUIDANCE ON THEOLOGY, PHILOSOPHY, AND MORAL CONDUCT.

PRACTICE AND INFLUENCE

HINDUISM INFLUENCES CULTURAL PRACTICES, SOCIAL STRUCTURE, ARTS, AND PHILOSOPHY IN SOUTH ASIA AND AMONG THE GLOBAL DIASPORA. ITS SPIRITUAL TEACHINGS HAVE ALSO ATTRACTED INTEREST WORLDWIDE.

BUDDHISM

BUDDHISM IS A MAJOR WORLD RELIGION THAT ORIGINATED IN INDIA IN THE 5TH TO 6TH CENTURY BCE WITH THE TEACHINGS OF SIDDHARTHA GAUTAMA, KNOWN AS THE BUDDHA. IT EMPHASIZES THE PATH TO ENLIGHTENMENT THROUGH ETHICAL LIVING, MEDITATION, AND WISDOM.

FUNDAMENTAL TEACHINGS

THE FOUR NOBLE TRUTHS AND THE EIGHTFOLD PATH FORM THE FOUNDATION OF BUDDHIST DOCTRINE. THESE TEACHINGS ADDRESS THE NATURE OF SUFFERING AND THE MEANS TO OVERCOME IT THROUGH MENTAL DISCIPLINE AND MORAL CONDUCT.

BRANCHES OF BUDDHISM

THERE ARE SEVERAL BRANCHES OF BUDDHISM, INCLUDING THERAVADA, MAHAYANA, AND VAJRAYANA, EACH WITH UNIQUE PRACTICES AND INTERPRETATIONS OF THE BUDDHA'S TEACHINGS.

SIKHISM

SIKHISM ORIGINATED IN THE 15TH CENTURY IN THE PUNJAB REGION OF INDIA. IT EMPHASIZES THE ONENESS OF GOD, EQUALITY OF ALL PEOPLE, AND THE IMPORTANCE OF LIVING A TRUTHFUL, DISCIPLINED LIFE. THE GURU GRANTH SAHIB IS THE CENTRAL SCRIPTURE OF SIKHISM.

JAINISM

JAINISM IS AN ANCIENT INDIAN RELIGION THAT TEACHES NON-VIOLENCE (AHIMSA), TRUTH, AND ASCETICISM. IT FOCUSES ON LIBERATION OF THE SOUL THROUGH ETHICAL LIVING AND SELF-DISCIPLINE.

BAHÁ'Í FAITH

THE BAHÁ'Í FAITH PROMOTES THE UNITY OF ALL RELIGIONS AND HUMANITY. FOUNDED IN THE 19TH CENTURY, IT TEACHES THE ONENESS OF GOD, EQUALITY, AND UNIVERSAL PEACE.

INDIGENOUS AND FOLK RELIGIONS

MANY INDIGENOUS CULTURES MAINTAIN TRADITIONAL SPIRITUAL PRACTICES CONNECTED TO NATURE, ANCESTORS, AND COMMUNITY LIFE. THESE RELIGIONS CONTRIBUTE TO THE DIVERSITY OF RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION GLOBALLY.

The first chapter, Is There a God?, inclines toward this belief and sets the stage for the next five chapters, each on a major world religion. The chapters Angels, Miracles, and Reincarnation reflect mainly the viewpoints of these religions. The main focus, however, is on Islam. Toward this end the penultimate chapter, Is the Qur'an God's Word? attempts to answer this question in the affirmative, while the final chapter is devoted to two views within Islam regarding the all-important topic of Life after Death. The first is the majority-held view regarding belief in a soul-body dualism, while the second view holds that there is no soul, only a body. Overall, the intent is to provide a springboard for further reading and discussion by the interested reader.
