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what does love really mean: Rose of the Flats Dario Addario, 2019-07-16 I am Tony Valentino, the prime narrator of Rose of the Flats, a novel about prejudice in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. I had thought I was writing about the experiences of my younger brother Dante, a Korean War combat veteran who was successfully becoming an English teacher at our local high school after the war. Unlike me, he could easily pass for white. But he had been arrogant enough to marry Rose, our sweetheart since childhood, who could not pass. Although I narrated the story in 1957, it is just as relevant now as it was then. Our father was an immigrant Jew from Italy, married to our immigrant French Canadian mother, who was Catholic and was partially black. When the novel opens, I am living with Rose, taking care of Dante. Two years ago, someone in a passing car had taken a shot at him one night. His car swerved and crashed into a tree, leaving him severely brain damaged. Our isolated little community is really part of Berlin, the only city in the northern part of our state, which, back then, was like Quebec. Most of the people in Berlin could not understand English. Cascade Flats is technically within the town line of Gorham, a tourist town five miles down the road. It is proudly American. Our state motto is Live free, or die. In my senior year in high school, I fell madly in love with my attractive young English teacher, the epitome of American womanhood, the woman I had planned to marry, to live free or die with. I wasn't going to be stuck with a woman of the flats, not I. But having been thrust into such close proximity with Rose, I became aware of our deep feelings for each other, especially of our strong sexual attraction, which I had refused to fully acknowledge when she had given me the opportunities. The Joy of my life, I had thought, had been white. In trying to tell Dante's story, I was really telling my own story, forced by Rose to face my own demons, my deepest anxieties and feelings of guilt for having coveted the devoted, passionate wife of my own brother. To finally survive our situation, I was compelled to overcome my own prejudices.

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but could it also begin to make sense of itself? Could it not? Think about your own existence and tell me, how did you learn to multiply and divide, or to choose more suitable clothing for cold weather before stepping outside? What does it mean to connect or to love for you, and what does it mean for another friend of yours? We learned from our interactions and our past, internalizing every detail that makes us who we are. This is what makes us unique and exceptional—because we are a “whole of meanings.” Now think of humanity, of humankind carrying the accumulation of a journey spanning thousands of years. All its passions, hunger, loves, destructiveness, awareness, every pain, and every milestone it has passed. Don’t say it’s impossible—all knowledge about humanity is already available on the internet. And now, this knowledge is at the service of an evolving being: artificial intelligence. I can almost hear your thoughts: “It’s under our control...” “We can stop it whenever we want, we’ll just shut it down...” “We’ll only use it for good purposes...” Then let me ask you, can you truly keep it under control—a being with millions of details, countless integrated systems, and the ability to improve itself? Do you really believe it can’t step beyond any of those lines? It’s up to you. And this is precisely where Mira and Eren’s story begins. In the following lines, you’ll witness the place where Eren stands. Fiction, imagination, reality... But my question is different: Where are you in this story?
