- Each lesson has three or more pages of exercises or activities.
- Objectives for the lessons are listed in a box at the top of each new lesson.
- Letters are presented in a large format suitable for young learners.
- Children use a crayon to form the large letters.
- Instructions for forming the letter - top to bottom - left to right - are provided.
- New letters are introduced with a short sentence and a picture depicting that sentence.
- The key word(s) for the letter are pronounced with the teacher emphasizing the first sound.
